




Covenant Bible Study Tuesday Mornings Beginning September 29 at 10:00 a.m.

Covenant guides participants in a comprehensive indepth study of the Bible. The study emphasizes the biblical concept of *covenant* as a unifying theme through all the books of the Old & New Testaments. It underscores the

unique relationship that God chooses to have with humanity. This relationship is grounded in the faithfulness of God's love and in our ongoing commitment to love God while we share signs of God's love with other people. Covenant is a 24 week study. We will complete the study in three 8 week sessions; 1 fall, 1 winter, & 1 spring. Folks are encouraged (but not required) to plan to complete all three sessions.

Cost for the study guides are: \$20 for 1 session or \$49 for all 3 sessions A large print version of the study guide is available for additional cost.



Our Fall music season is beginning. There are groups available for all ages and levels of musical ability. 



For the Saturday night (2 hour) creative session, Joyce Lambert and Mary Ann Greene led the group in painting a *fall tree* in acrylics. The group could paint from the example provided or create their own painting from their special memories. The purpose of the session was to be able to relax, have some fun and look for the beauty in God's creation.

Most of the participants had little or no experience in painting in acrylics; however, some of them have graciously agreed to share their work for the First Presbyterian Fall Art Exhibit.



Montaña de Luz Revisited

Virginia Currie, Skeet Ayscue and Cherry Ayscue (Skeet's sister-in-law) set out on August 22 for Honduras on what was the 10^{th} mission trip sponsored by First Presbyterian Church to Montaña de Luz. They were joined by a church educator from New Mexico, two social workers from Akron, Ohio, a student from Liberty University and our leader, Ruth Deyoe. Many of the children of Montaña de Luz were waiting to greet this group upon arriving on campus. After the traditional singing of a greeting and response by the group, soft knitted balls were thrown back and forth – a tradition started by the First Pres contingent three years ago thanks to Janet Schaefer's knitting.

A variety of jobs awaited the group and they immediately plunged in the next morning. A cistern system was being planned for the older boys' house located in the village below. The initial part of the job consisted of digging (by hand) an eight foot deep by 10 foot wide by 15 foot long hole for the tank. As you can imagine, it took several days to dig a hole that large. Once that was done, a rebar mesh was constructed and insert in the bottom. Then the traditional "cement dance" began with four shovelers mixing concrete on the ground, forming a volcano like hole in the middle to fill with water, and then circling the perimeter of the mound while scooping the mixture from the base and sliding it down the inside. Eventually, the mound is thoroughly mixed and the cement wheelbarrowed over to the hole and poured in. Later, the walls will be bricked, the water tank installed, and a pump added to give the boys a reliable source of running water.

In addition to that large job, many other tasks were accomplished. The overheat light in the younger boys' new bathroom was rewired into the new ceiling. The bathroom was then painted by members of the group. A second bathroom with an outside entrance was also constructed with cement "flinging" being a new learned skill. The large garden area behind the dorm area has been transformed by a long-term volunteer from Ohio and it produce is used to provide food for the children. Much weed pulling, plant bed preparation, and planting occurred during the week with fantastic results. Other electrical work, supply sorting, more painting, and fence mending occurred during the week stay.

As always, the biggest highlight of the week is the time spent with the children of Montaña de Luz. Each day started with devotions in the chapel with the children who then were off to school. Late afternoons with the children were spent dancing, coloring, exercising, playing games, jumping rope, making ice cream, and just hanging out together. Several evenings were spent playing spoons (a rollicking card game) with the older girls and down in the village with the boys. An exciting ending to one evening was chasing a wondering rat in the dining area around the building for a good half hour. Some of the group watched atop tables. This episode earned the group the nickname of "The Ratpack".

As always, lots of new friendships were formed with the children, and among the group members who are spread across the US. A check was delivered from First Presbyterian for \$1000 which came from the Mission Trip fund and will be used to purchase a new washing machine, as the current machine broke down just before the group arrived. At some future date, the pictures of the trip will be shared and more of the stories told.
