



#### **SCCM Caring & Sharing Campaign**

It is time once again for the Stanly Community Christian Ministry's annual Caring & Sharing campaign. SCCM has been at the aid of those in need for thirty years. Now, it is in need of assistance of its own. The nonprofit organization has been experiencing a difficult times in a strained economy - donations are down, yet demands are still high. The funds raised in the *Caring & Sharing* campaign go directly for client assistance such as help with electric bills, rent, and heating. ## Storms & Flooding Clean-Up Buckets Collection November 1-30

These disasters raise the need for Gift of the Heart Cleanup Buckets. Supplies offer help for families as they begin the overwhelming task of storm and flood cleanup. A cleanup bucket drive is being sponsored by the Presbytery of Charlotte Community Disaster Response Team. The drive will last through the end of November. The goal is to collect 200 buckets. First Presbyteryerian Church of Albemarle has a goal to fill 10 buckets. Buckets are provided. Please place your donated items in the designated bins in the pit stop.



#### **Mabumbu Well Update**

We are looking into alternate methods of digging the well other than by shovel. One method is called a *percussion drill*, a manual method of driving a steel bit into the ground. These can be manufactured locally and are easily transportable. On testing the drill, Keith Waddell found that it was not very effective in the clay below the sand layer. They modified the drill into an auger, that will twist when it hits the ground. That seemed to work well. We are hopeful that work on the Mabumbu well will begin soon although we do not at present have a timeline for that.

## **Cleanup Buckets Needed**

Storms. Tornadoes. Flooding.

These disasters raise the need for *Gift of the Heart* Cleanup Buckets. These supplies offer help for families as they begin the overwhelming task of storm and flood clean up.

#### Contents

5-gallon bucket with resealable lid

5 scouring pads

7 sponges, assorted sizes

1 scrub brush

5 dust masks

50 clothespins

Clothesline, two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.

1 box dry laundry detergent, 50-78 oz.

1 pair work gloves

2 pair latex gloves (like Playtex®)

1 liquid concentrated household cleaner (like Lysol®), 12 oz.\*

1 bottle liquid disinfectant dish soap (like Dawn®), 25 oz.\*

1 pkg. cleaning towels (18 reusable, like Easy Wipes®)

24-count roll heavy-duty trash bags (33-45 gallon)

1 bottle insect repellant (drops or lotion, not aerosol), 6-14 oz.\*

\*\*liquids in plastic bottles only



This clean up bucket drive is sponsored by the Presbytery of Charlotte Community Disaster Response Team. The drive will last through the end of December. Our goal is to collect 200 buckets.

When your church has completed it's drive, contact the Presbytery's Community Disaster Response Team (CDRT) at presby.disaster.response@gmail.com or by phone at 704-892-1580. We will then set up at least one collection point in every county and will email or call each church with details. Once all buckets are collected, they will be delivered to the central warehouse in Maryland for future distribution to disaster sites.



Youth Club will focus on *Grace and Gratitude* during this wonderful time of Thanksgiving as they practice for the Joy Gift Program on Sunday, December 13. *The Inn Crowd* musical fits well with the theme for Youth Club this year, "Deepening Community Through Grace & Gratitude," as it teaches everyone that Jesus came for everyone, and that because of Him, we're **ALL** definitely in God's Kingdom. The children will also be given the opportunity to participate in providing gifts for six children from the Angel Tree (a Helping Hands ministry), which again reminds them of God's grace and deep gratitude for what often is taken for granted.

Our keynoter for this retreat will be Pastor David Kilde. The theme for the retreat will be "Saint and Citizen." We will be discussing the challenges of being a faithful witness in the context of a multi-cultural democracy. This promises to be a compelling retreat and discussion.



## From the Technology Committee...

In summer 2014, a church Technology Committee was formed to identify the technology needs of the church and to recommend and implement steps to address those needs. Members of this on-going committee are Marlene Sanges, chair; Bob Johnston; Mary Kesselman; Stan Scheer (staff member); Matt Drumheller (staff member); and Thomas Taylor (*ex officio*). Over the past year, here are the highlights of that committee.

- 1. Thomas Taylor was hired by the committee as our IT professional. He is responsible for updating and maintaining our network and computers.
- 2. Our movie theater projector was broken, and the equipment was outdated. We replaced the projector and added a blue-ray player. We replaced VGA cables with HDMI, creating much better quality picture and sound. All equipment was paid for through donations.
- 3. A new, dedicated laptop (donated) and mounted projector were added to the choir room. These are welcome additions for our Youth Club staff and Music & Arts program, and of course they may be used with any of our music programs.
- 4. Our roving laptop and projector cart (housed in the media center) now has a new laptop computer, following the demise of our very old, original laptop.
- 5. Hopefully, you've noticed our brand new website! Matt, working with Dustin Poplin at Uwharrie Technology, launched the site several months ago, and it only gets better and better. A really nice feature is that you now have the option of making pledge payments, honorarium and memorial gifts, Living Legacy donations, etc. online. We continue to have a Facebook page as well.
- 6. A new recorder and duplicator were purchased for our sanctuary sound system when it became apparent that it was going to be more expensive to repair them than to replace them outright.
- 7. We now have an amazing rear projector/projection screen/blue-ray player/projection cabinet/sound system combo in the gym, which is the envy of practically every outside person who sees it.
- 8. We have a "roving" Chromecast that allows a person to use his/her smart phone, tablet, or laptop to wirelessly stream media to a TV.
- 9. We have replaced 3 old staff computers with newer models and are planning to use the old ones to create a mini-lab for members of the congregation to use. Small-group classes and training sessions will be made available if there is sufficient interest.
- 10. Our most recent addition is the Sony Smart TV "message board" in the Pit Stop, which allows information to be presented slideshow-style. This is a work in progress, so we are still trying to work out a few kinks. We expect this to be a major help during the upcoming Presbytery meeting when many announcements will need to be broadcast.
- 11. The wi-fi system, which had a couple of outage areas, has been updated and is now available throughout the entire church.

Most of these projects were made possible thanks to the Gaither Endowment and several generous individuals. Should you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to ask any member of the committee.
