As Lent is a 40 day season used to prepare Christians for the resurrection of Jesus, we will highlight its importance by observing the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper each Sunday.

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**Ten-Cents-A-Meal...**We will receive the Ten-Cents-A-Meal offering for hunger on March 5. This monthly offering is used by the Presbytery of Charlotte to fund hunger programs and agencies (including SCCM) throughout the presbytery. Ten cents per person per meal is just \$9.00 per month and helps provide people both nourishment and hope. If you don't have a Ten-Cents-A-Meal container, you can find one in the pit stop. Checks and/or coins are welcome!

# **Lent 2017**



Our excellent Lent planning team (Rebekah Ayscue, Laura McLeod, Ronnie Michael, and Lynn White) has been hard at work planning a Lenten season that will bring the congregation and friends together around scripture, the table, meals, and in worship.

The theme for Lent is Awakening.

#### Some Highlights

#### Wednesday Worship at 5:50 p.m.

It's 15-20 minutes worship for people of all ages, however they're dressed.

The usual elements of prayer, song, and scripture will be present.

Meals Together on Wednesday Evenings...in restaurants (since the gym is being renovated)

The Cross Walk on Good Friday at 10:30 a.m.

The scripture used on Sundays, Wednesdays, and for small gatherings will be taken from John's gospel and point toward people whose encounters with Jesus have *Awakened* them to life in the kingdom of God.

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The forty day journey to Easter begins on March 1.

There will be two worship opportunities.

# Worship at Noon: Music and Meditation

For thirty minutes, the sanctuary will be filled with instrumental music, prayer, and scripture reading. Come for this contemplative time together. Ashes will be available.

# Worship at 6:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary

# Gym Renovation Plans **!!!** Renovation has begun **!!!**

Contractor: Stokes Construction Company

What will be done to the gym?

- New windows will be installed.
- The drop ceiling will be removed and new lighting installed.
- Electric darkening shades will be installed at each window.
- New (electric) basketball goals will be installed; the goals will have the capacity to be lowered to 5 feet.
- The door at the back of the gym will be reconfigured so the chair racks will easily move in and out of the gym.
- The gym and stairwell will be painted.
- The floor (gym, stage, and storage closeds) will be repaired, refinished, and lines repainted.
- Under stage doors will be updated.
- The metal stairs leading to the parking lot will be replaced.

How long will the work take? If all goes precisely according to plans, the work will take 56 business days. No matter what, the gym will be available for Music & Arts Camp in June.

What is the projected cost? \$230,000.00...though unexpected issues may cause an increase in the price.

How are the fundraising efforts going?

Thanks to your generosity, we are well on the way to having pledges to cover the basic cost. It's not too late for you to make a pledge.



# **Book Conversation**


The Wonder by Emma Donoghue Book:






#### **Hosting Habitat Volunteers from Bucknell University Coming Our Way**


# Confirmation Class Update

# Youth Club


#### March at Youth Club

March 1 is **Ash Wednesday** and the Youth Club children will have a special service with Pastors Elizabeth and Matt in the Chapel during their *Bible time*. They will learn about this special day as it begins the Lenten season. The imposition of the ashes in the shape of a cross on their foreheads will remind the children that they belong to Christ; and in those 40 days ahead, we will all try to live our lives growing closer to Christ. During *Music* with Mr. Frank the children will learn some new songs that will be shared with the congregation on Sundays, March 12<sup>th</sup> (Trusty Travelers) and 19<sup>th</sup> (Faith Explorers).



**Faith Explorers (4**th & 5th graders) will continue reading the book *Wonder by* R.J. Palacio and lessons will wrap around the questions: Who are you? What makes you unique? What gifts has God given to you? How do you see yourself? I wonder what God sees when he looks at you? These questions and answers will lead them into discovering their "self image" and they will paint self portraits, which will later be on display in the Children's Art Gallery. The scripture focus is Ephesians 2:10 "We are God's masterpiece." During this Lenten season the children will realize from their lessons that God wanted **them** to be **them**. 'He made you to be you.' Real self-esteem comes from three facts: God created you, Jesus died for you and God's Spirit lives in you.

**Trusty Travelers (K-3**<sup>rd</sup> **graders)** will spend the month learning more about Jesus as he goes fishing for men and turning them into disciples (Luke 5), how these disciples learn to pray (Luke 11) and how he assures these disciples that God is in charge as He Calms the Storm (Luke 8 and Matthew 8). Through the *Children of God Storybook Bible, Archbishop Desmond Tutu* retells these stories, artfully highlighting God's desire for all people to love one another and to find peace and forgiveness in their hearts. Following each story and lesson, the children will write prayers, asking God to help them "follow Jesus, pray, and trust him when they are afraid."





#### **Youth Cubs**

One of many children's favorite Bible stories is about David and Goliath. It is an amazing story! David was a hero to his people long ago. Through his faith in God, David was able to overcome what others thought was impossible. His victory over Goliath is truly a tale of strong faith and the following of God's plan for him. God has a plan for each of our preschoolers as they learn to trust Him to protect their lives. The children will participate in art activities and role playing associated with the story. The

Cubs will hear about Jonah and how he tried to hide from God. They will learn that when they do wrong things, instead of trying to forget about it, or hiding from God, He wants them to tell Him about it and to ask forgiveness. We will use a blanket as an imaginary boat to act out the story, and play "Pin Jonah in the Whale" game.
