Early worship makes it possible to enjoy more of the afternoon outside.


# **SUMMER WORSHIP NOTES**

### Presbytery of Charlotte Update

At its 134<sup>th</sup> stated meeting on May 16, 2017, the Presbytery of Charlotte spent time discussing a proposal from its Strategic Planning Task Force. In June 2014, our presbytery commissioned a group of elders and pastors called the Emmaus Team to work with Presbyterian churches and members from all over Charlotte to create a new vision for the presbytery. This led to many round table conversations, including one that took place at First Presbyterian Church, Albemarle. Out of these discussions and the Emmaus Team's work came a vision for the Presbytery: **Joining Jesus the risen Christ in building, celebrating, and anticipating the kingdom of God in our seven counties and beyond.** 



With the Emamus Team's work completed, the presbytery appointed a task force to propose how we might put that vision into action. This group of people, including our very own elder Jim Carter, spent the last year creating a strategic plan for the presbytery based on the vision created by the Emmaus team. Their hard work was presented to the presbytery on May 18<sup>th</sup>, and their plan was approved, and will be implemented over the next 9 months.

This new strategic plan will primarily affect the structure of the presbytery. The presbytery will shift from top-down, committee oversight toward bottom-up, grassroots initiative. Rather than having several committees that attempt to envision ministries for our area churches, there will be one ministry resource committee. This committee will provide resources for individuals, churches, or groups of churches in the presbytery who feel called to a particular ministry field. This committee is designed to respond to God at work in individuals and churches in the presbytery, rather than seeking to direct their discernment.

God is already at work acting in our churches, and we are seeking to acknowledge, support, and facilitate one another. Please pray for us – the presbytery – as we pursue reformation and seek to partner with one another building, celebrating, and anticipating the kingdom of God in our seven counties and beyond.

# Summer Youth Ministry Script


### Youth Connection Monday Morning Missions





### Montreat Youth Conference July 9-15




