PROTESTANT REFORMATION 500TH ANNIVERSARY



1517 – 2017

We will celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation this year. We will recognize this watershed event in several ways.

- For four Sundays in October, Elizabeth will teach an adult Sunday School class on the Reformation. We'll look at historical events, the catalyst for the Reformation, and what was lost and gained...and what that means for the Presbyterian Church of our time.
- Matt and Elizabeth will preach a four session sermon series on the theological implications in word and deed of the Protestant Reformation.
- On October 29 (Reformation Sunday), we will be joined for morning worship by fellow Presbyterians in Stanly County. We look forward to participation from the Locust and Norwood Presbyterian churches. We'll also be led in worship by Thomas Hahn on the bagpipes.



July Mission Trip to Montaña de Luz

On July 19, Anna Wainwright, Lex Poolos, and Skeet Ayscue were joined by three of Skeet's relatives (Cherry Ayscue, Bonnie and Chelsea Gatewood) for the 12th First Presbyterian Church sponsored trip to Montaña de Luz, the orphanage for children with HIV. The best discovery of the trip was that all the children were in reasonably good health with no major issues at the time. All seemed happy and eager to host the Americans for the week.

The first day started with Skeet helping get the wiring connected for a new water pump. This enabled the holding tank to fill, and more importantly to the group, allowed the hot water tanks to fill for warm showers. Most of the work days were spent at the older boys' house down in the village where the boys are learning to cook, clean, and live on their own with the help of Tio Marlon and Tio Daniel. The latest project there was to complete an outdoor kitchen by building some brick walls. An outdoor kitchen is quite useful when the electricity occasionally goes off, and also to keep the cooking heat out of the house. It resembles a car port with a pila (outdoor cement water pool for washing clothes, etc.) and, eventually, a brick and cement wood cooking stove.

The tasks included building forms with rebar and thick wire, hauling bricks, mixing cement for the vertical wall finishes, mixing mortar for brick laying, and getting quick lessons on proper bricking techniques. Anna and Lex turned out to be the *expert* brick layers as they balanced on the rear of the pila to complete the wall behind it. The rest of the *support* crew, kept the mortar moist and available, supplied the bricks, helped eyeing the alignment, and tapped the bricks in half when needed. In the meantime, Skeet also repaired a ceiling fan inside, and installed two others to make the rooms more comfortable.

Each day began with devotions with some of the children and Tias in the chapel, followed by a group devotion before work began. After work, the group prepared an activity or two for the children. Some of these included painting, relay races, making ice cream, constructing clay animals with a story about Noah's ark, a water balloon fight, and an evening of *capture the flag*. Lots of individual fun time was spent with the children as well. An excursion day included a trip to the national park in the capital, a visit with the older children living in Santa Lucia as a stepping stone to living on their own, and lunch and shopping at Villa de Angeles.

Members of our church donated seven tubs full of supplies for the trip and the staff was very excited and thankful for your generous gifts. This relationship with Montaña de Luz is a legacy of which First Presbyterian Church can be very proud.

Thanks from Montaña de Luz...Your donation of more than \$2700.00 will pay for new shoes and pants for <u>all</u> of the kids. We are grateful for all your congregation does for our children. God is working miracles through you.
