
Ash / Wednesday

Ash Wednesday...February 14

The Lenten journey appropriately begins in worship. This year, there are two options.

Worship at Noon: Music and Meditation... For thirty minutes, the sanctuary will be filled with instrumental music, prayer, and scripture reading. Come for this contemplative time together. Ashes will be available.

Worship at 6:30 p.m. in the Pit Stop...Plan to begin this season of penitence and preparation in worship. We will be reminded of our sin by the imposition of ashes. We will feast at the table of our Lord Jesus Christ to gain strength for the journey. Childcare provided.



Living the Word

The Lent planning committee, made up of Jim Carter, Steve Cumming, Mike King, and Gayle Russell, has planned a Lenten season that will help the congregation focus on the meaning of discipleship. Through worship, small groups, Wednesday night meals, and individual prayer, we will spend time reflecting on specific words of Jesus that give us insight into our calling.

The theme for Lent is *Living the Word*.

Here are some things you won't want to miss:

- Wednesday Night Food for Body and Soul: Including evening prayer, dinner, and time to reflect together on our Lenten theme using both words and art.
- Worship on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.
- The Cross Walk on Good Friday at 10:30 a.m.
- Camping at Morrow Mountain on Easter Eve.

Lenten Small Groups

Beginning the week of February 18, small groups will gather weekly for discussion and prayer around our theme, *Living the Word*. Some groups will be stationary and others will be on the move. All groups meet for approximately 1 hour each week.

Cooking Group
