2018 Flower Calendar







We are also blessed with our families, dear friends, and, very importantly, the amazing pastors, staff and fellow members of the First Presbyterian Church.

Yes, God has been very generous to us with His many blessings.

Our Stewardship campaign for 2019 will officially kick off on Rally Day, September 9. To this day, we can recall Anne Montgomery's welcoming words and smile as we walked through the doors. Over the intervening years, our family has grown, and we were able to find a *family* that has been a blessing to us in more ways than we can ever say.

Just like a real family, our church family has shared our joy in the births of three more children, and shared our sorrow over two miscarriages. Our church family has prayed for us and supported us when Laura's mother died. Meals have been prepared for us following surgeries and births. Pastors and church members have prayed with us and for us. We in turn have prayed for and supported friends and fellow congregation members during times of celebration and grief.

Our children have been raised knowing an entire congregation cares for them, loves them, and prays for them. Their milestones have been celebrated and recognized. We have watched other children grow up in our congregation to be come babysitters and go on to later become parents themselves. Friendships have developed from our time at First Presbyterian that we know will last a lifetime.

First Presbyterian has served as our family, friends, teachers, and counselors through the years. Life in Albemarle would be so very different if we had not walked through the doors of this church twenty years ago. We feel blessed and grateful for this special place. Our time here goes beyond worship. The relationship we have with our church helps define who we are, what is important to us, comforts us, and guides us.

SESSION NOTES

At its stated meeting on August 19, 2018, Session heard reports from Worship, Christian Education, Personnel, Stewardship Interpretation and Finance, Property, Mission, Nominating and Endowment committees. The Worship committee reminded everyone that on Sunday, September 2, worship will be held at the YMCA park at 9 a.m. The Christian Education committee is preparing for Rally Day on September 9; Youth Club will begin on September 12; volunteers are needed for after-school programs on Wednesdays beginning September 12. The Personnel committee will meet with a candidate for the Christian Education position on Tuesday, August 21. The Stewardship committee reported that stewardship season will begin soon; the theme this year is "Sharing God's Many Blessings." Letters will be sent to the congregation in October and will ask members to increase pledges for the coming year, as fixed expenses are expected to increase. Consecration Sunday will be held on November 5. The Property committee reported that Dun Rite Pro cleaned interior and exterior windows in July, and discussions about resolving the acoustics problem in the gym are still in progress. The Mission committee would like to thank everyone who participated in the Circle the Sanctuary for SCCM; the amount of food donated was approximately 500 pounds. The committee also thanked everyone who helped with the Community Inn fund-raiser on August 17. The committee will sponsor a luncheon for staff and teachers of Central School on August 20 and will present the teachers with the school supplies that were donated by members of the congregation. The Mission committee recommended to Session that the September 30 Faith on the Fifth offering be designated for the Habitat for Humanity project; Session approved the recommendation. The Nominating committee is reviewing nominations for Deacons and Elders for the class of 2021; a congregational meeting will be called on October 21 to elect the slate of officers. The Endowment committee met in July and approved applications for Gaither grants. Grants were awarded for cleaning of church windows, new carpet for the minister's office, communion supplies, money for Youth Club, scholarships for the women's and congregational retreats, and kitchen supplies. Dona Lisk and Jim Marshall reported on the Presbytery meeting that was held in Charlotte on August 18. Ministers' report stated that a committee has been formed for the Habit for Humanity project; pledge cards may be sent to the congregation for this project. The Greater Albemarle Ministerial Association (GAMA) has scheduled a workday for September 29; work will be done in local schools, beginning at 8 a.m. GAMA is also sponsoring a Unity Walk on World Communion Sunday, October 6. Two representatives from Session will attend the Presbytery meeting in Monroe on October 23. REMINDERS: the women's retreat will be held on September 28-30; the congregational retreat will be held at Morrow Mountain October 12-14.


