With Easter behind us and summer fast approaching, I am making my final plans for a three-month sabbatical. Beginning May 20, I will be spending time this summer in rest, spiritual renewal, and continuing education. I will spend time visiting with my family and Claire's family. Claire and I will take a trip in mid-June to Scotland where we will hike the West Highland Way from outside of Glasgow to Ft. William. This 100-mile hike will take us about 9 days to complete. - In 2017, the number of people experiencing hunger around the world increased for the third year in a row. Much of the increase in hunger is due to climate change, conflict, and economic downturn.
- **Forty-five percent** of all preventable child deaths are linked to malnutrition.
- One in 4 of the world's children (151 million children) suffers from physical and cognitivie stunting, which is irreversible and heartbreaking for mother and child a life sentence.
- Good nutrition for mother and child during pregnancy and the child's first two years is critical to brain development, health, and future wellbeing.
- Premature births, pneumonia, diarrhea, malaria, and other illnesses result in 5.4 million deaths of children under age 5 every year. Almost half of those children die of causes related to malnutrition.




