### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX MINISTRY**

The green and red shoeboxes will be available in the Pit Stop. Pick-up a flyer to learn the most recent information about packing a box. (Exclude candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toys guns, knives, or military figurines; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions;

medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow-globes or glass containers; aerosol cans). <u>Boxes need to be returned</u> to the church office by November 10. Remember that shoeboxes are distributed by churches in over 100 countries who will nurture the child in their faith. As you pack your box, pray for the child who will receive it along with the gospel printed in their own language. It has been estimated that thirty or more family members and friends will also read and receive the good news through the booklet. It will be the greatest GIFT they ever receive! (And we ever share!) If you're not a shopper, a donation of \$15 will help with shipping a box and the 12 week follow-up discipleship course, *The Greatest Journey*.

The cooperative is benefitted through a steady income from larger orders placed throughout the year; **AND** they have input into setting a fair price for their product.

Youth Club is under way in earnest for the fall. With new and returning youth and new and returning volunteers, there is a great positive energy around the building on Wednesday afternoons. As they play, eat, learn, create artwork, and sing, children from the church and the community have an opportunity to encounter Christ. Please continue to keep this important program in your prayers!

**Trust Travelers (K-3<sup>rd</sup> Graders):** Knowing that the seasons of the church change just like the seasons of the world, our children are exploring the Bible through the cycle of the seasons. Beginning with Pentecost, they are exploring how the church year flows and they are exploring Scripture that matches this seasonal cycle. Through the seasons and holidays of the church, they will better understand God at work in their lives.

**The Faith Explorers' (4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Graders):** The curriculum this year is based on Big Faith Questions, which have been provided by our Faith Explorers themselves. We will be delving into different topics and Bible stories that the children have questions about. We hope to gain more knowledge about "holy mysteries" and lean deeper into our faith.







HARVEST \*Trail Mix\*

This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.



### What you need:

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- $\frac{2}{3}$  cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup raisins
- $\frac{2}{3}$  cup dried fruit (any)

### What you do:

- 1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- 2. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- 3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
- 4. Store in airtight container.


