# **Session Notes**

At its stated meeting on October 20, 2019, Session welcomed Dr. Bill Jolly, who presented the annual report of the columbarium committee, and then heard reports from Worship, Christian Education, Stewardship, Property, Mission and Gaither Endowment committees. The Worship committee asked Session to approve the baptism of Margot Johnson, daughter of Taylor and Lisa Johnston. The Christian Education committee reported that Youth Club is going well, and that the committee will be meeting later this month to work out details of activities that have been scheduled. The Stewardship committee announced that pledge cards were either picked up or mailed out and encouraged members of Session to return pledge cards by October 20 and that a congregational lunch will be held on Consecration Sunday, October 20. The Property committee reported that four security cameras have been installed at outside entrances to the church and that the locks on outside entrances have been replaced with keypads. Congregation members who have keys to the church are encouraged to return the keys to the church office. The Gaither Endowment committee met and approved funds for the recently installed security cameras and keypad locks. The Mission committee reported that the SERVV bazaar will be held on November 10. This will be the last opportunity to order items from the SERVV catalog. The Central School backpack program started again in September. One of the participating churches has dropped out of the program, and as a result, First Presbyterian will be filling packs on an additional date each month. The Sharing and Caring collection has ended but cups may still be returned. First Presbyterian will host the meal at the Community Table on Saturday, November 9. Sign-up sheets are posted in the Pit Stop. Alternative gifts will be available for purchase beginning November 24 and continuing for four weeks. Ministers' report: Rev. Drumheller will lead a discussion in the parlor about the "Purple Church" at 3:30 p.m. on October 20. Session will host a luncheon following worship on December 1, the first Sunday of Advent. The menu will include chili, cornbread, and other delicious treats. Rev. Ayscue will not be in worship on November 24. She will be assisting at Macedonia Presbyterian Church. Tammy Ocampo was welcomed into membership at First Presbyterian by Session on October 20. The next stated Session meeting is scheduled for Sunday, December 15, 2019, at 6:30 p.m.
