Dear Friends,

The story of Epiphany is about the revealing of Christ to the world. In the appearance of the star, creation reveals the incarnation of God in the world. In the journey and gifts of the magi, Christ is revealed to the Gentiles. The weeks following Epiphany give us stories in Scripture of Christ's ongoing revelation to Israel. Christ recruits his disciples, revealing himself to the people of Israel. He then spreads the good news of God's grace and teaches his followers to be messengers of the good news. This season ends with the miraculous revelation of Jesus in his transfiguration.


