Mother's Day/Father's Day Offering Sunday, May 10

We find ourselves in unprecedented times, and the support of our mission – to honor God by enriching the lives and touching the hearts of those we serve - means more than ever. The needs of the senior adults we serve may increase in this volatile climate, and your church's continued support offers a deep sense of security to those living within our communities.

The mission of The Presbyterian Homes, Inc. and its communities is to honor God by enriching the lives and touching the hearts of those we serve.

- This year, The Presbyterian Homes, Inc. expects the need for resident financial assistance at our three continuing care retirement communities: Glenaire in Cary, River Landing at Sandy Ridge in Colfax/High Point and Scotia Village in Laurinburg, to be over \$1.5 million. That does not include the difference between the full cost of care and the shortfall of Medicaid reimbursement, expected as an additional \$2 million. Contributions through the Mother's Day/Father's Day Offering provide an important portion of this financial assistance. Through support from donors, no resident has ever been asked to leave a Presbyterian Homes' retirement community because their financial resources have run short due to circumstances beyond their control. Some of those receiving assistance have faithfully served the church and/or our communities during their years of employment.
- The Presbyterian Homes has partnered with DHIC and Capital Towers in Raleigh, an affordable rental community currently serving 150 seniors of very modest means. Support through the Mother's Day/Father's Day Offering will help to provide a Service Coordinator position for residents of Capital Towers. This position is assisting residents as they address immediate needs related to therapy, temporary housing, transportation, medical or dental care, nutrition and wellness.

To access the video, go to the First Presbyterian Church website (www.fpcalbemarle.org) and click on the Storytime banner.


Tuesdays at 1:15 p.m. for 1st-3rd Graders via Zoom


Community Table Lunch on Saturday, May 16

The Crisis Assistance Fund is a nonprofit organization established over 20 years ago by the churches of Stanly County. Our mission is to provide emergency assistance to those is crisis situations, such as losing a job or an injury or illness. Our mission is to help people stay in their homes when an emergency arises, by assisting with rent or utilities, in order to avoid eviction, foreclosure, or disconnection of services. In 2019, CAF distributed \$28,000 in emergency funds and helped 109 individuals stay in their homes in Stanly County.




Youth Sunday May 17


