Dear Friends,

We are entering the third month since the death of George Floyd and a renewed awakening in our nation to the realities of systemic racism. We are entering the third month of *summer vacation* for our students and teachers as they prepare to return to school, unsure of what that return will look like.

As we mark all of these significant things with anxiety and anticipation, I am also aware of another important marker for our congregation. On August 15, 2002, Elizabeth McNair Ayscue began serving First Presbyterian Church as its pastor. In those 18 years, the positive impacts of her ministry in this place have been noticeable. The congregation has thrived, both in growth and in faithful discipleship. Compassionate care for our neighbors in Stanly County and around the world has become a cornerstone of life and ministry at First Presbyterian Church. You have grown in your love of God, love of one another, and love for Elizabeth. Her ministry in this church has truly been a blessing for the congregation and, indeed, for Albemarle.

As we prepare for Elizabeth's retirement at the end of August, I am incredibly thankful for the time that I have had with her as my colleague. I encourage you to join me in celebrating her time in this place. Thank God for the gift of her calling to First Presbyterian Church. Thank her for all that she has done. Wish her well as she moves into the next phase of her journey of discipleship. As we prepare for this parting, the words of Philippians 1 ring in my mind: *I thank God every time I remember you*.






