


# **Morning Prayer**



On Sunday, August 30, we inaugurated a set of tubular bells (chimes) that was added to the organ this summer. Although the organ built in 2007 retained the set of chimes from the first pipe organ dating to 1924, these chimes had 20 notes and not the current standard 25-note compass. Music written for chimes often exceeded this short compass, which required rewriting the music to accommodate the missing notes. The previous set of chimes also were installed at the very back of the organ, which rendered them very soft to listeners in the pews. The new chimes are visible to the right of the organ where they can be heard more prominently in the sanctuary. While these chimes are new to us, this particular set was built more than 50 years ago. Although the name *chimes* is usually associated with this type of percussion instrument, it is more properly referred to

as *tubular bells*, which reflects the desire to imitate the harmonic development of church bells. What is special about this set is the way they were designed and manufactured. Organists and organ technicians often refer to them as *graduated diameter* chimes because the tubes for the low notes are larger diameter than those for the upper notes. This provides appropriate tonal resonance to all the notes rather than just the correct pitch.

Over time, chime manufacturers decreased the cost of chime sets by using the same small diameter metal tube for all of the notes. While these tubes played the correct pitches, the musical quality was greatly diminished especially in the low and mid-range notes. Shortly after this set was installed in a church in Richmond, Virginia in 1964, the company making these bells discontinued making them in favor of cheaper sets. It has not been possible to buy new graduated-diameter chimes for decades, and it is extremely rare that a used set becomes available, which makes this addition to our musical resources very special. While I hoped to solve the problem of the short musical compass and the lack of presence of their sound in the sanctuary, I never imagined that the solution would involve acquiring tubular bells of this type and quality. I have been asked where they came from, and the answer is about as unlikely as one could imagine. I discovered them two blocks from the church in a warehouse on Depot Street. Albemarle resident, Graham Hatley purchased the organ that was originally installed in St. Benedict Catholic Church in Richmond, Virginia. The organ had been removed from that building and was in storage in northern Virginia for years. After Graham purchased the organ and moved it to Albemarle, he asked me to look at the instrument in his warehouse where I discovered this rare set of chimes. He was not planning to use them so we arranged to purchase them. The playing mechanism from the 1964 installation would not fit our physical location so we had a new mechanism built by Organ Supply Industries of Erie, Pennsylvania. This summer our organ technician, Morris Spearman, installed the mechanism and wired them to the organ's switching system. I want to thank John Hahn and Thomas Hahn for their assistance in helping to get the chimes mechanism hung on the wall, and to Ann Duckwall for cleaning years of grime from the surfaces of the 25 tubes.




# TRUNK OR TREAT SUNDAY, OCTOBER 25 5:00 P.M.-6:00 P.M. CHURCH PARKING LOT


# Education and Conversation Monday, October 26 at 7:00 p.m. via Zoom
