Dr. McCurdy was Head of the Organ Department at Westminster, organist at First Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, and one of Mr. Scheer's teachers.

The Belhar Confession was written in South Africa in 1986 to address the divisive nature of apartheid. It specifically addresses reconciliation and forgiveness. It was adopted by the PC(USA) in 2016.
