Our mission is to help people stay in their homes when an emergency arises, by assisting with rent or utilities, in order to avoid eviction, foreclosure, or disconnection of services. In 2019, CAF distributed \$28,000 in emergency funds 19 individuals stay in their homes in Stanly County.
