#### **Pfeiffer Friends**

Last fall, the Health Sciences Program of Pfeiffer University opened its doors in downtown Albemarle. As of the January enrollment, there are approximately 90 students from across the United States and the world who are working on a degree in the Physician's Assistant or Occupational Therapy Programs. Many of these students are a long way from home and they have taken a leap of faith to be in this program.

Several downtown church, including First Presbyterian Church, are moving forward with a partnership with these students similar to our Silent Partner program. There are two main differences: the relationship will last about 27 months (the length of each program) and the Pfeiffer student will know who their friend is. We hope that there will be communication at least once a month between the friend and the student.

We will match a member of one of our churches with a Pfeiffer student. The student understands that this relationship is not a "pull into church" but rather a friendly connection with someone in the community. To support these hard-working students, the community member will send notes of encouragement, gift cards, gift boxes, or anything to support them. For your convenience, these items can be dropped off at the Pfeiffer campus in downtown Albemarle or mailed directly to your student.

#### 2021 Community Health Assessment Survey

Do you have an opinion about health issues and community concerns? Do you want to make a difference? Here is your opportunity to be heard. The Stanly County Health Department and Atrium Health Stanly are jointly conducting the 2021 Community Health Assessment. A public opinion survey is a key component of this assessment. Stanly County residents 15 years old and older

are being asked to complete this survey. The survey can be accessed at the Stanly County Health Department's website http://health.stanlycountync.gov/ or Stanly County's website https://www.stanlycountync.gov/ through February 17, 2021. It will only take 15-20 minutes to complete a survey.

Why should you complete a survey?

- 1. Your input makes a difference as the results from the survey are used by the hospital and health department to help determine their priorities and develop action plans.
- 2. You help bring funds to Stanly County as this report is used by county municipalities, agencies, organizations and others to obtain grants. Most grantors request a community health assessment when writing grants. This community health assessment report can be used to meet that requirement.
