






Central Elementary School Backpack Food Program Donations Needed:

The four children would often go without food and adequate clothing. Sometimes their mother would be so mad at the energy and unruly nature of the children that she didn't know what to do, so she hit them. It was a chaotic environment without much structure or support.



handle any of the emotions she was feeling at 8 years old. Over time, neighbors noticed, teachers at school noticed, and social services noticed. All four children were removed from the home to keep them safe: one of Kayla's sisters moved to another state to live with relatives, her two other siblings went to live somewhere else, and Kayla found herself alone for the first time. That was five years ago.

After two years of living in different foster homes and even a pre-adoptive home, Kayla suffered another loss – the family who had said they were interested in adopting her decided they couldn't move forward with the adoption because they didn't have the skills needed to help Kayla regulate her emotions and find peace with her past.

Like so many other youth who enter "the system," Kayla needed help – real help to address a past filled with violence and neglect, help to address all of the emotions wrapped up inside her that she didn't know how to handle, help that allowed her to move forward

Kayla found that help when she came to live with a therapeutic foster family at Children's Hope Alliance. It wasn't an easy transition, but Children's Hope Alliance staff members, including a well-trained therapist, and the CHA foster family were committed. In therapy, Kayla began to face her past trauma. At home, the foster parents helped her to experience life with a healthy family.

Kayla has made tremendous progress. Recently, she completed her stay with the therapeutic foster family and is now living in a forever home. She is thriving in her new community and learning to trust her new forever family, just as she trusted her previous foster family. And, most importantly, she's excited about what her future holds, thanks to caring, generous people like you.

IMPORTANT COVID UPDATED INFORMATION

as of November 7

For the health and welfare of our members and our community, the COVID Task Force Committee has set the following guidelines with the following updates:

- **UPDATE:** Masks are **optional** for ALL FPC **indoor** functions/activities/SS/Worship, etc.
- **UPDATE:** Masks are **strongly encouraged** for unvaccinated individuals.
- ❖ Masks will always be provided at the church for adults and children in case they are needed.
- ❖ After worship, Rev. George will stand outside the door at the sanctuary so "crowding" will not take place.
- ❖ Hand sanitizer is available. Please use it.
- **UPDATE:** Bibles, Hymnals, and Friendship Registers will be returned to pews.
- Singing will continue.
- Communion will be given with prepackaged elements.
- **UPDATE:** Elder greeters will resume.
- **UPDATE:** Ushers will resume passing offering plates during Worship.
- ❖ All volunteers and paid employees involved in any children's program(s) are required to be vaccinated.
- **UPDATE:** Church building and GYM will be available for outside groups (meetings, rentals, pickleball, basketball, etc.).
- **UPDATE:** Meals may resume for SNL.
- All toys, chairs, tables and bathrooms, (used that day) are to be wiped clean with a Clorox wipe or sprayed and wiped clean.
- First Family meals will be drive-thru.
- Church Committees, Community Committees/groups are welcome to use the main building for meetings. However, any child that might accompany a parent to a meeting must stay in the same room with the parent at all times.
- ❖ All surfaces (chairs and tables and bathrooms if used) have to be wiped clean (with spray or wipes) after any committee meets.

Your patience and flexibility are appreciated as we continue to deal with the pandemic.

The COVID Task Force and Session continue to assess the COVID situation and return to church activities with the safety of the congregation in mind.
