Dear Friends,

Because the date for Easter is based on the lunar calendar, it is one of those dates that shifts every year. Based on when Easter falls, the church's calendar shifts and adjusts every year, and the lectionary seeks to accommodate that. One of the effects is that the season after Christmas and before Lent (called Ordinary Time...as in *ordinal*) varies in length. This year the season after Epiphany before Lent is a rather long one.

This has helped me reflect on the ongoing Epiphanies taking place all around us. Just as this portion of Christ's life was filled with revelations of God's glory (the definition of "epiphany") so too is God's glory being revealed among us. From our progress on the Habitat for Humanity project, to the work of our Opioid Taskforce, to the beginning of our confirmation class, and the wonderful routine joy of the life of the church, God's glory is being revealed in this place.

SOUPER BOWL OF CARING
SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 3



Our church will be participating in the Souper Bowl of Caring on Sunday, February 3rd. More than 20 years ago, this ministry began with a single youth group that prayed a simple prayer:

Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us to be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat.

Our youth will collect money and cans of food at the doors of the sanctuary following worship.

Pewsitters on the right side (choir loft side) of the middle section, the right section, or the balcony, are asked to bring chicken noodle soup.

Pewsitters on the left side of the middle section, the left section, or the section near the sound board, are asked to bring tomato soup.

Matt's Sabbatical

Beginning May 20, Matt will be taking a three month sabbatical in accordance with his terms of call. He will be away for June and July and will return on August 18. During that time, he will be reading and studying about pastoral leadership in an age of increasing polarization and tribalism. He will be exploring the practice of moderating conversations of deep disagreement within faith

communities. He will also spend some time visiting colleagues, hiking with Claire in Scotland, and serving the broader church by co-directing two of the summer Montreat Youth Conferences. Stay tuned for further updates and details!



Looking Toward Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6, and concludes with shouts of *He is Risen* on Easter morning (Sunday, April 21). A planning group is already gathered to make plans for a meaningful journey through these 40 days. Details will emerge as we move closer to Ash Wednesday.

Our 2019 Confirmation Class began meeting in late January. Our seven youth, including Graham Chapman, Angus Currie, Katherine Jolly, Maci Holshouser, Leah Kilde, Andy McLeod, and Ethan Richards, are meeting weekly to explore their faith. We are using a brand new PC(USA) curriculum called *Big God, Big Questions* focused around the questions that confirmands will be asked when they join the church. Please keep these youth, their families, and their mentors in your prayers as they go through the important exploration time in their life of faith.





News from Our Neighboring Presbyterian Churches

We sit in the *eastern cluster* of the Presbytery of Charlotte. In our cluster (Stanly, Richmond, Anson, & Montgomery counties) there are 13 churches and 5 installed pastors (2 in Albemarle, Julie Hill in Norwood, Cathy George in Mount Gilead, and Matt Baker in Candor). All other churches depend almost entirely on leadership provided by Session members, folks who come

to *fill the pulpit* regularly or occasionally and temporary pastors. That means that sometimes congregations will go months without the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper because there is no one to officiate at the table. It means congregational meetings and Session meetings are moderated by pastors from other churches, and sometimes elders preach on Sunday mornings. As an extension of their ordination vows, Matt and Elizabeth will sometimes be called upon to share in duties at the 9 churches who do not have consistent pastoral leadership, occasionally even on a Sunday morning. It is a blessing that our congregation is able to *share the wealth* in the kingdom of God.


