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IMPORTANT UPDATED COVID INFORMATION

The church COVID Task Force met on Thursday, August 12. After much discussion, for the health and welfare of our members and our community, and with GREAT emphasis placed on keeping our children safe, the committee has set the following guidelines:

BEGINNING SUNDAY, AUGUST 15, 2021

- Masks are required for all individuals, 2 years of age and up, at ALL FPC <u>indoor</u> functions/activities/SS/Worship, etc.
- There is NO limit on numbers at this time. Please be thoughtful in your actions.
- Masks will always be provided at the church for adults and children in case they are needed.
- After worship, the Supply Minister will stand outside the door at the sanctuary so *crowding* will not take place.
- ✤ Hand sanitizer is available. Please use it.
- Bulletins will continue to be available.
- Singing will continue.
- Communion will be given with prepackaged elements.
- ✤ Acolyte can wear robe.
- ✤ No Elder Greeters.
- Ushers will continue their duties.
- All volunteers and paid employees involved in any children's program(s) are required to be vaccinated.
- No activity in the Education Building other than Sunday childcare & Wednesday Youth Club.
- All toys, chairs, tables and bathrooms, (used that day) are to be wiped clean with a Clorox wipe or sprayed and wiped clean.
- UPDATE: Individually packaged snacks/drinks will be provided for Youth Club children on Wednesdays.
- UPDATE: First Family meals will be drive-thru.
- Church Committees, Community Committees/groups are welcome to use the main building for meetings. However, any child that might accompany a parent to a meeting must stay in the same room with the parent at all times.
- All surfaces (chairs and tables and bathrooms if used) have to be wiped clean (with spray or wipes) after any committee meets.
- ✤ NO gym use EXCEPT FOR WEDNESDAY YOUTH CLUB.

Seeker's Class (Old Session Room-Basement) Led by: Dr. Bill Jolly

Like his original hearers, many people today find Jesus' sayings hard. Some sayings are hard because they are difficult to understand, others because the demands they make on us are only too clear. F. F. Bruce examines seventy of the hard sayings of Jesus to clear away the cultural and historical difficulties which keep us from grappling with the real challenge of Jesus' message. Evident in each chapter is Bruce's keen evangelical scholarship and pastoral insight. Participants will look at a different hard saying each week and discuss. One example of a hard saying of Jesus is, *But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you*.

Greenwood Summary: It's 2038 and Jacinda (Jake) Greenwood is a storyteller and a liar, an overqualified tour guide babysitting ultra-rich vacationers in one of the world's last remaining forests. It's 2008 and Liam Greenwood is a carpenter, sprawled on his back after a workplace fall, calling out from the concrete floor of an empty mansion. It's 1974 and Willow Greenwood is out of jail, free after being locked up for one of her endless series of environmental protests: attempts at atonement for the sins of her father's once vast and violent timber empire. It's 1934 and Everett Greenwood is alone, as usual, in his maple-syrup camp squat, when he hears the cries of an abandoned infant and gets tangled up in the web of a crime, secrets, and betrayal that will cling to his family for decades.

And throughout, there are trees: a steady, silent pulse thrumming beneath Christie's effortless sentences, working as a guiding metaphor for withering, weathering, and survival. A shining, intricate clockwork of a novel, *Greenwood* is a rain-soaked and sundappled story of the bonds and breaking points of money and love, wood, and blood—and the hopeful, impossible task of growing toward the light.



The Wired Word Sunday School Class (Church Parlor) Led by: Various Facilitators

The class meets each week and discusses current events and Bible verses that relate to that event. Every Thursday morning, an email is sent to class members from *The Wired Word* organization (a non-denominational group) that contains three key elements: 1) a two-page summary of a specific current event or news item, 2) a few *key questions* to stimulate your thinking about the article and 3) several Bible verses which relate directly to issues in the news article or the key questions.

You can read the lesson at your convenience and spend as much (or little) time thinking about it. In class on Sunday, the facilitator will briefly review highlights of the news article and lead the discussion of the key questions and Bible verses. Importantly, there are no right or wrong answers, and you are free to take an active role in the discussion or just listen to the thoughts of others. No one is put on the spot to answer a question. Our group has fun together, and we learn a lot about how the Bible encourages us to think about current events/issues. Because the lesson is different every week, it does not matter if you miss a week or more at a time for whatever the reason. Please come and give it a try! You may just get *hooked* as so many of us are.

From the Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee...

What happens next?

In August, Jan Edmiston, Charlotte General Presbyter, gave a brief overview of what this transitional time will look like for First Presbyterian Church, Albemarle. Through September, Matt Drumheller organized supply pastors for our congregation. (This is not typical, and we are grateful!)

The Transitional Pastor Search Committee began meeting July 27. This committee is tasked with creating a job description, organizing the salary package, reviewing resumes, and identifying our Transitional Pastor. The committee prayerfully considered four candidates and has made an

offer to the candidate the committee unanimously supports. More information will be shared in the coming weeks, but we will have our new Transitional Pastor in the pulpit for the first Sunday of October. After our Transitional Pastor is in place, the pastor and committee will work together to conduct a mission study. We will use the mission study to identify our priorities as a congregation, so we can call our next pastor who will best fit for us going forward.

The student understands that this relationship is not a pull into church, but that of a person who wants to be a friend to the student while the student is in school in our community. The friend will send notes of encouragement; gift cards; gift boxes or the like in order to give the Pfeiffer student some support. Many of these students are a long way from home; have taken a leap of faith to be in this program and at the same time have committed to work hard, get this degree and go in to Rural Healthcare.
