From Where I Sit

Dear Friends,

January 2022. I guess it's true what they say....'time flies'. I'm praying you have a healthy and blessed new year, and I look forward to our continued ministry together in the coming days. One thing I love about a new year is that, though I may plan and plan and plan, there are lots of 'I don't knows...' that have to be accounted for. And I do.

One of the 'I don't knows' that may have crossed your mind is what-in-the-world is happening with the search for an Installed Pastor. While there's a whole lot about that that



remains unknowable, there are a few things I know and wanted to share with you. This is a rough plan for the search process that I will update regularly in this article so that you stay up-to-date. Some 'code' words you need to know:

COM = Committee on Ministry; PNC = Pastor Nominating Committee

MIF = Ministry Information Form (church's resume); PIF = Personal Information Form (candidate's resume).

And here are the Steps of the Installed Pastor Search:

- 1. Transitional Pastor Called
- 2. COM approves the formation of the PNC.
- 3. Once elected, COM liaison conducts orientation/training of the PNC.
- 4. Mission Study/Creation of MIF.
- 5. MIF must be approved by the Session of the church and by the COM to determine that it accurately reflects who the congregation is and the nature of the call.
- 6. MIF posted on the PCUSA Church Leadership Connection and one of the COM co-moderators will approve the MIF to upload.
- 7. Review of potential candidates.
- 8. When the PNC narrows to a few candidates and begins planning face to face visits, General Presbyter the performs an "exec check".
- 9. PNC selects final candidate and conducts interviews and extends a call.
- 10. The COM approves the transfer of the candidate, reviewing the PIF and the terms of call.
- 11. The PNC gets permission to go to their Session to request a congregational meeting be held to vote on their recommendation.
- 12. Installed Pastor is called and installed.

Please let me know if you have any questions about this process. In the meantime, let's continue to be faithful to God's call to us to tend to the work of ministry at hand, trusting God's guidance, leadership, and grace.

And that's the view from where I sit.

IMPORTANT COVID UPDATED INFORMATION **UPDATED ON DECEMBER 8, 2021**

For the health and welfare of our members and our community, the COVID Task Force Committee has set the following guidelines with the following updates:

The COVID Task Force continues to monitor the positivity rate in Stanly County. Unfortunately, this rate has increased and Stanly County has a high transmission rate. Your best protection is vaccination, booster, masking and social distancing.

- UPDATE: Masks are REQUIRED for ALL FPC indoor functions/activities/SS/Worship, etc.
- * Masks will always be provided at the church for adults and children in case they are needed.
- Hand sanitizer is available. Please use it.
- If you are sick, please stay at home.
- UPDATE: Singing will continue. Congregation encouraged to wear masks. Choir members may remove masks for singing and are socially distanced from congregation.
- Communion will be given with prepackaged elements. **
- All volunteers and paid employees involved in any children's program(s) are required to be vaccinated. *
- UPDATE: Church building and Gym may be used for outside groups that are already using the facility but no more outside groups may reserve the facility until positivity rate improves.
- UPDATE: Any small groups having meals/snacks (SNL, Youth Club, Men's Prayer Breakfast) may ** continue but should social distance while eating and wear masks when not eating
- All toys, chairs, tables and bathrooms, (used that day) are to be wiped clean with a Clorox wipe or sprayed ** and wiped clean.
- First Family meals will be drive-thru.
- All surfaces (chairs and tables and bathrooms if used) have to be wiped clean (with spray or wipes) after any committee/group meets.

January Book Conversation Monday, January 24 at 7:00 p.m. in the Parlor


The January book is Fifty Words for Rain by Asha Lemmie. We will meet in the parlor at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, January 24.

POP ART


Do you like looking at bold images of everyday items painted in bright colors? This type of art is called *Pop Art*, and it began in the 1950s. Pop Art is a style of art based on simple, bold images of everyday items, such as soup cans, painted in bright colors.


The term *pop art* originated with Lawrence Alloway, a British museum supervisor. He used the term to describe the new form of popular art that had a modern feel and the phrase stuck. Many famous artists who participated in this artistic movement became household names.

Andy Warhol is known for his paintings of Campbell's soup cans. He also painted animals, movie stars, musicians, and other well-known people. Warhol used small dots of bright color to create the paintings and became famous for using this method.

Roy Lichtenstein was famous for creating images inspired by comic strips and advertisements. He used a stencil style of painting because he wanted his work to look like it had been printed.

This year, the GHA Creative Arts students are exploring this artistic medium by using simple images and adding bright bold colors in a comic book style. Our courageous students have expressed themselves through their artworks more than words can express.
