From the Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee...

What happens next?

Last week, Jan Edmiston, Charlotte General Presbyter, gave a brief overview of what this transitional time will look like for First Presbyterian Church, Albemarle. Through September, Matt Drumheller organized supply pastors for our congregation. (This is not typical, and we are grateful!) If we do not have a Transitional Pastor in place by the end of the September, the Worship Committee will help fill the pulpit weekly.

The Transitional Pastor Search Committee began meeting July 27. This committee is tasked with creating a job description, organizing the salary package, reviewing resumes, and identifying our Transitional Pastor. After that pastor is in place, the pastor and committee will work together to conduct a mission study. We will use the mission study to identify our priorities as a congregation, so we can call the pastor that is the best fit for us going forward.
