





### **A Stewardship Moment**

On Sunday, September 25, Martha Sue Hall, member of our Church and Deacon, described to us how our stewardship giving shelters those that need a home:

“Mary motioned to her three small children to be VERY quiet. They pressed up tightly against a wall behind their mother and tiptoed past the open den door. Inside the room, their emotionally and physically abusive father and husband was absent mindedly playing a video game. After years of such treatment, Mary had determined to leave. The little group safely opened the front door, noiselessly got into the old SUV in the driveway, and Mary drove away, never to return. She had no idea where to go or where to turn!

“Since its founding in 2005, First Presbyterian Church has made a sizable yearly investment in the facilities and programs of Homes of Hope, made possible only because of your generous weekly gifts of tithes and offerings. The only agency in Stanly County addressing the issues of homelessness, Homes of Hope owns or rents ten houses where homeless parent(s) and their children can live safely for six months. The houses are simply furnished but have the conveniences of washer and dryer. The adult(s) enter into a structured agreement with the agency program Director and participate during their tenure in a series of workshops, including financial literacy, budgeting, nutrition, and health. The objective is to give the parent(s) needed confidence and skill to renew and re-acclimate themselves into work and productive society.

“Homes of Hope also administers emergency overnight shelter at the Community Inn on First Street. Guests who have no place to sleep find lodging there, safe-haven, comfort, encouragement, and respect. Hundreds of church and community volunteers throughout Stanly County deliver evening meals and stay for dinner after the guests check in. First Presbyterian Church is one of the earliest, most faithful, and committed Meal Providers and has a dedicated monthly number of church members who serve, visit, and care.

“Today Mary rents her own lovely home, has found critical medical help for her two autistic children, her youngest child is a high school athletic standout, she is a customer service representative for a household products company, and she has a promising new career with the United States Post Office.

While the Stewardship campaign is about giving of our time, talent, and treasures, we sometimes forget that as we give to our Church, we are using those resources to promote wholeness and healing by directly supporting agencies and missions in our community like Homes for Hope.

So to remind you of the important work our Church provides in our community, every Sunday until October 30, there will be a Church leader “painting the stewardship picture” during the Offertory. We will connect how giving of your time and money make a difference in the lives of those we serve.... children, hungry, homeless, elderly, youth, each other, and the Lord. Please consider our mission and outreach to our community (like the example above) when you dedicate your pledge on November 6.

Finally, you may have seen baskets of marbles around the Church. Please take a marble if you don't have one or another for someone else and let it serve to remind you of the call to respond to God's Word and the way that Christ lived. Keep and carry that marble with you....in your pocket or in your purse.... anywhere to remind you that our stewardship call is a response to “such a time as this.”
