"Painting the Picture of Stewardship"

On Sunday, October 2, Chris Whitley shared the following message to paint how our pledges, time and talents make a difference in Albemarle and surrounding areas. Chris stated:

"Our church makes an impact on this community and serves others because of your faithful and continuing generosity. Earlier this summer, in a six-week reading program sponsored by Central United Methodist Church, sixteen rising first graders attended "Book Buddies Literacy Camp". These students from East and Central Elementary Schools were chosen so that newly acquired skills would be strengthened instead of lost over the summer and their reading competency brought to a higher level. Field trips to the zoo, time at the library, and STEM courses facilitated by Pfeiffer University complimented daily reading, phonics, and play sessions.

"The thrilled director highlighted one particular camper scheduled to be held back in Kindergarten and not advance with his friends to the next grade. He achieved remarkable gains at Literacy Camp. His confidence, self-esteem, love

of reading, and new foundation for all future success grew exponentially! And, yes, he will now be going to the First Grade with the rest of his classmates.

"A decision was made through our Mission Committee to help sponsor the camp on behalf of our church congregation. This is our church at its best; encouraging others to develop their talents, abilities, and skills to the fullest and grow in their recognition of God's abundant grace! Because of your giving, our congregation joins the church universal in changing lives!! "Your faithful and generous giving has a direct impact on the mission and ministry of First Presbyterian Church Albemarle!

While the Stewardship campaign is about giving of our time, talent, and treasures, we sometimes forget that as we give to our Church, we are using those resources to promote hope and human development by directly supporting agencies and missions in our community like Book Buddies Literacy Camp.

So to remind you of the important work our Church provides in our community, every Sunday until October 30, there will be a Church leader "painting the stewardship picture" during the Offertory. We will connect how giving of your time and money make a difference in the lives of those we serve.... children, hungry, homeless, elderly, youth, each other, and the Lord. Please consider our mission and outreach to our community (like the example above) when you dedicate your pledge on November 6.

Finally, you may have seen baskets of marbles around the Church. Please take a marble if you don't have one or another for someone else and let it serve to remind you of the call to respond to God's Word and the way that Christ lived. Keep and carry that marble with you...in your pocket or in your purse... anywhere to remind you that our stewardship call is a response to "such a time as this."
